Low Acuity Needs

- Surgery >1 day in hospital/ complex inpatient care
- No health surveillance
- No PCP
- Fertility preservation needs/ pregnant
- Cognitive Impairment/Sensory deficits (HOH, vision, speech)
- Dental needs
- Difficulty coping
- Requires Navigator contact less than once per week

Moderate Acuity Needs

- Comorbidities new () chronic ()
- Dental needs
- Language barrier/ cultural barriers
- Cognitive Impairment/ sensory deficits (HOH, vision, speech)
- Difficulty coping
- PEG needs new() established ()
- Trach needs new() established ()
- Ostomy needs new() established ()
- Requires Navigator contact one to two times per week

High Acuity Needs

- Starting treatment (chemo/RT)
- Treatment non-compliance/ appointment no-show >2
- New PEG tube**
- New Tracheostomy**
- New Colostomy/ Ileostomy**
- Complex treatment/ overwhelming for patient
- Requires office visit with Navigator
- ECOG equal or greater than 2 with no caregiver
- Coordination of multiple appointments/ referrals/ departments
- Uncontrolled pain
- Language barrier/ cultural barriers
- Cognitive Impairment/ sensory deficits (HOH, vision, speech)
- Experiencing treatment side effects
- Requires Navigator contact greater than two times per week
