

Multidisciplinary Oncology Clinic (MDOC)
Physician Criteria

Category I – Six Competencies

1. **Patient Care** – All physicians will be board certified in their specialty to provide patient care. *Active certification must be maintained.*
2. **Medical Knowledge** – All physicians will adhere to published national evidence based treatment guidelines in their clinic recommendations.
3. **Practice-based Learning and Improvement** – All physicians will complete Category I CME in disease site of clinic (**10** hours each for breast, thoracic, gastrointestinal, urologic, **5** hours melanoma).
4. **Professionalism** – All physicians will achieve **70%** ‘satisfactory’ rating in annual survey by peers.
5. **Interpersonal & Communication Skills** – All physicians will achieve **70%** ‘satisfactory’ rating in annual survey by peers.
6. **Systems based** – All physicians will comply with policies and procedures of the MDOC, Cancer Center and Novant Health.

Category II – Commitment

1. **Punctuality/ attendance at assigned MDOC clinic rotations**
2. **Maintain active privileges at Healthcare**
3. **Case referral/ presentation-** Refer **3** cases (per disease site/clinic) for presentation, either to clinic or conference, for breast, gastrointestinal, urologic, thoracic, and melanoma.
4. **Attendance/ participation at tumor boards - 40 %** attendance at tumor board for gastrointestinal clinic, thoracic conference for thoracic clinic, & Friday breast forum for breast clinic.
5. **Medical management of cases (inpatient/outpatient) at Presbyterian facilities-** Each physician will treat minimum of **8** cases annually (per disease site/clinic) in breast, gastrointestinal, thoracic, urologic, & **3** cases in melanoma.

- **Site specific Advisory Boards**
